
The American Way of Strategy: U.S. Foreign Policy and the American Way of Life

When American leaders have followed this path, they have led our nation from success to success, and when they have deviated from it, the results have been disastrous. Framed in an engaging historical narrative, the book makes an important contribution to contemporary debates.
